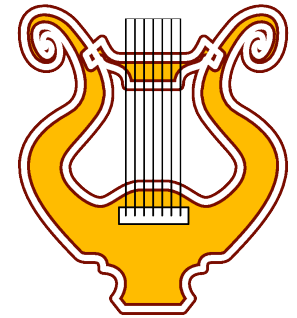

Thomas Jefferson, our 3rd president, played cello, violin and clavichord. John Quincy Adams, our 6th president played the flute. Chester Arthur, the 21st President, played the banjo. Woodrow Wilson, the 28th president, was a violinist. Harry Truman, the 33rd president, was a well-known pianist. Richard Nixon, the 37th President played piano and accordion. Bill Clinton, 42nd President, was a fine sax player. Warren Harding, our 29th President, wins the prize as he played all instruments except trombone and clarinet. Finally, Franklin Roosevelt, President # 32, played the organ.

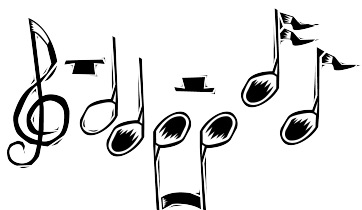

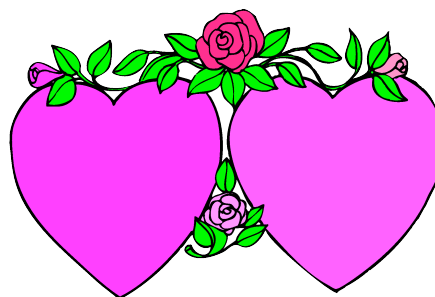
FEBRUARY CONCERTS
